


Hello! BONG 18 at last!







First, on the October 26th episode of the American soap opera "General Hospital" the instrumental, "Memphisto," was heard in the segment featuring Felica Jones weekend gathering in the mountains. The same show played the same song in a January 1993 episode as background music during the aftermath scenes of Felica's trial. What the trial was about, we have no idea, but we thank Ashley Collins of Shelbyville, Texas and Alisa Brook from somwhere in the US for that bit of info. MTV(US) used the track, "Policy Of Truth" during an episode of "The Real World." MTV(US) also used, "Enjoy The Silence" for the ending of an episode of "The Half Hour Comedy Show." We did not receive specific dates when the episodes aired from Tiffany Tucker from Springfield, Missouri who was kind enough to send us the info, but we thank her just the same. Tiffany also said she heard the track, "Waiting For The Night" in a commercial, but she didn't remember what the commercial was about. If anyone knows which commercial she is referring to please let us know. We'd also be interested in

knowing how you feel about DM's material being used to sell products or other TV shows. This could be an interesting topic and we're eager to print your responses in the next issue. On the February 12, edition of 20/20 they played excerpts from Recoil's "Faith Healer" during a segment about Tamarriage's life. Thanks go out to Alex Ball from Sewickley, Pennsylvania for that bit of information. We'd also like to thank Jodi Lee from Redding, California who wrote in to tell us that "Kaleid" was during a profile on why Americans are failing in the long distance running events. Thanks continue to Olga in Spain who wrote to tell us that last August on one of the private TV channels in Spain "Leave In Silence" for about 20 seconds in a trailer for the film, "No Way Out." Last, but not least, we send thanks to Jurgen Stein from Holland who informed us that the "Oil Tank Mix" of "World In My Eyes" is being used as the introduction theme to a Dutch TV talk show called "Met Witteman" (Witteman being the name of the host). The show mainly deals with political and sociological subjects. Final thanks go to Tanja Muras from Germany who sent in news that the German TV documentary, "Die Tatler," that deals with the sexual mistreatment of children, used "PIMPF" as it's theme tune.

In August 1992 the Depeche Mode movie 101 was played at an open-air cinema in Berlin. According to our source, Sebastian Sinterhauf from Berlin, everyone was singing along and standing up. Sebastian says, "It was just like a real concert!"

Sebastian also reports that the German magazine Bravo has a regular reader's chart and "World In My Eyes" has spent a record 80 weeks and counting on the chart. The average placement is around 10/15. According to the accompanying editorial, Bravo state that it's the first time a single band has stayed on the chart so long.

Andy Cooper from Illinois who wrote to tell us that the December 1, 1992 issue of LIFE magazine featured a "40 years of Rock" special and Depeche Mode was mentioned in the 80's section.



"Depeche Mode Friends," the Prague based Czech DM Fan Club are having their annual convention at the Lucerna Hall in Venceslav Square, Prague, on April 3, 1993. The event begins at 4:00 PM and continues until midnight. The entrance fee is 50 Czech Crowns (around £1.00/\$1.50). Tickets will be available in advance from the box office. As well as the "DM Friends" merchandise on sale there will also be DM prizes and giveaways. Among the competitions will be a DM megamix competition, look-a-like competition, Trivia quizzes, afterentifice de la Prophingie Also during the evening Will be live acts, a DM disco, and videos.

In further reference to "DM Friends," more specifically the "Adopt A Fan" service (see BONG 17 for details), the response has not been as good as anticipated. We would really like to get this idea off the ground, but we need your help. Again, if you would like to assist in "spreading the news around the world" by paying a one year membership for an Eastern European fan, please write to us. Your efforts will not go overlooked.

Anyway, continuing on the subject of conventions, anyone interested in attending a Danish convention should contact Louise Westi Lauritsen, Fangekrogen 20, 3400 Hillerod, Denmark.

Among the growing number of Depeche Mode covers is a version of "Policy Of Truth" by the German band, Terry Hoax. The track was played at the November convention and the band's British representatives brought along copies of the single, album, and some T-shirts to give out to the crowd. No other cover has generated so much positive interest by BONG members. The single has been receiving a lot of MTV (Europe) air play and is currently available in the UK in single format and on the LP Freedom Circus. Their reason for covering "Policy Of Truth"? "We've always done covers...In 1986 Martin Gore claimed the guitar to be dead, along with Rock 'n' Roll, but he's proven that's not true now that he's playing the guitar again..."

Now that information is all out of the way, lets get down to the real business at hand. New Depeche Mode product.

"I Feel You," the first commercial DM release in almost three years was released world-wide on February 15, (February 16, in the US). It entered the UK Gallup chart at number 8, 25 in Austria, 12 in Belgium, 18 in Denmark, 1 in Finland, 5 in France, 21 in Germany, 1 in Greece, 6 in Ireland, 13 in Israel, 1 in Italy, 14 in Norway, 7 in Portugal, 1 in Spain, 5 in Sweden, and 70 in the US upon its release. At the time of press, Belgium was up to 5, Denmark up to 5, then 2, Finland down to 4, Germany up to 10, Italy down to 3, Spain down to 3, UK down to 9, then 22, and the US was up to 37. Full chart position update to "I Feel you" and entry positions for the album and the next single "Walking In My Shoes" (see stop the press for further details) in the next issue.


The recording of the long-awaited Depeche Mode album *Songs Of Faith & Devotion* was finished in a London studio in December. Upon it's completion, Mute Records immediately pressed several CDs of the album and distributed them to DJs in Europe in late December. This led to a breach of the album in America, and two radio stations—we won't mention any names, but they know who they are—obtained a taped copy of the CD and aired several tracks of it in mid January. In addition to the radio stations, several fans also managed to obtain taped copies. One fan even put an entire review of the album on the US consumer computer network, Prodigy. Word of the incidents travelled quickly to the proper authorities and the breach was promptly dealt with.

Songs Of Faith & Devotion was released on March 22 (March 23, in the US). It is available on Compact Disc, Cassette, Vinyl, DCC, and Minidisc format. (Violator will also be released shortly on DCC and Minidisc.)

To celebrate the release of the new album, DM threw an exclusive "Global Release Party" on March 12th, in London at the Ministry of Sound. Various other clubs across Europe also participated in the event via Satellite to give the party a "global" feel. The guests at the London party were all UK based BONG members and competition winners from various parts of the world. The parties schedule included a viewing of the electronic press kit, album playback, a question and answer session with the band, a DJ, and dancing.

Sire Records also participated in the event by flying 30 fans from North America to attend the party and participate in the question and answer session with the band. The North American fans who attended the event were selected from 12 different cities from around the US and Canada through radio contests. Their trip also included; a sightseeing tour of London and a "meet and greet" with the band. A full report of the event will be featured in the next issue.

The entire event--including the question and answer session--was filmed, edited onto video, and used as the programming during similar release parties in North America on the weekend of March 19th.



DM spent two days at the end of January doing Press/TV/Radio for all of Europe including Holland, Belgium, France, Germany, Italy, and Spain.

Then in February they went to Copenhagen to do Scandinavian press and Radio. They also filmed a Danish TV interview in London and travelled to Prague with Anton for a press conference.

The first week of March was spent in New York, Toronto (Canada), and Los Angeles doing Press/TV/Radio for North America, including Modern Rock Live, a stateside, syndicated call in programme (We will try to print the transcripts in the next issue.) Press for Australia and the Far East were done via phone from America as well.

When we went to press a complete list of who the band had done press with was not available, but we will try to feature one in the next issue. Until then, check your local news stands and radio programmes for all the latest mode media.

On a more personal note, Andy Fletcher married his long time girlfriend, Grainne in a ceremony in London on January 16th, 1993.


Martin Gore was the best man, although he did not make a speech. The reception was held in a banqueting suite in West London with radio DJ and TV presenter Gary Crowley. Guests included Alan Wilder, Vince Clarke, and Alison Moyet as well as the couple's daughter, Megan. Fletch and Grainne then went to the Caribbean on Honeymoon.

On that note, we'll bring this edition of Montage to a close and until next time keep the information coming and let's all get ready for another DM year. Don't forget, if you send us some information and we use it in Montage, we'll send you something for your efforts.



The next single taken from Songs Of Faith & Devotion will be "Walking In My Shoes." It is scheduled for global release on April 26th. The B-side, sung by Dave, is called, "My Joy". It will be avilable on cassette single, 12" and CD single, and 12" and CD remix single. No 7" is sched-

uled as of yet. The remixes were done by William Orbit, Johnny Dollar (Massive Attack) and Spiritfeel--a Novamute signing who include Paul Valentine, the DJ who played the records on the *World Violation* Tour. The next magazine will be out after the release of this single so get your reviews in as soon as possable.

The X1 and X2 boxes were the result. Alan Wilder supervised most of the operation and made most of the decisions as to content of the CD's, packaging, etc. If you don't own this fine set of CD's and you know where you can get them, do yourself a favour and get them. They are a definite must for anyone who loves DM.


string backing-beautiful!


Dear Celine,

We're sorry you feel this way. Dave gave us the photo himself, as he and his wife wanted to share their happy news with all DM's fans. Here at BONG we have a




We'd be interested to hear from other fans on this matter--should BONG print DM news outside recording and touring details? We'll print your views on this in the next issue.




I'm 21 years old and this will be my 10th year as a Depeche Mode fan. Since 1983, as each new album was released I've been continually lifted to that "higher level" and the new album lifts me higher still.

As much as I loved *Violator* and wanted something similar, I knew this was never going to happen, because every new recording exhibits a change in musical style, atmosphere, and direction—and so with *Songs of Faith & Devotion* we again hear DM breaking new ground.

The evidence of *Violator* still looms in "Walking In My Shoes" and "Higher Love," but with this new, no, not new style, but progression in style we hear less evidence of synths and more 'real' sounds such as actual guitarrifts, string arrangements and hauntingly loud drum beats coupled with David's mellowed yet still forceful vocals and it's still unmistakably Depeche Mode.

Perhaps the most interesting aspect of this album is the variety of musical styles. It's got a little of everything. Hard rock in "I Feel You," gospel in "Condemnation," and "Get Right With Me," classical in "One



Caress," Celtic in "Judas," and the unmistakable classic Depeche Mode in "Walking In My Shoes," "In Your Room," and "Rush." The variety and unpredictability of this new offering will come as a surprise to those who expected another album like 'Violator' or something more technoish, but Depeche Mode have worked out the perfect answer to the question, "How can you top *Violator*?" They have.

So in effect, we have ahead of us a few more years of Depeche Mode before they disappear to make more babies and in the meantime we have Songs Of Faith & Devotion, a 18 month world tour, and the right to say "I told you so."

CHANNELL CONVENTION 1999

he 1992 Bong convention was planned to be a little different from those in past years. When the original idea of a two-day event had to be scrapped, it was action-stations to get everything ready in time for Camden Palace....

We arrived at 11:00 to find a couple of die-hard table grabbers already congregating for the 3:00 opening all of whom were desperately trying to find out what was in all the interestingly shaped boxes that were being carried into the venue, with rather hopeful questions such as "Is that keyboard one of the giveaways?" Well, just for the record, it wasn't a giveaway it was part of Coercion's live equipment, Coercion being the rather nervous band who were due to perform their first ever complete unrehearsed live set in front of a curious audience of guinea pigs. The band was set up by 1:00, just in time for the Camden Palace's sound engineer to start our sound check. Well,

that was the plan, what actually happened was the engineer rolled in at 2:45 giving us 15 minutes to sound check before the doors opened at 3:00. To the people that had been waiting patiently outside the doors for several hours, I apologise!

For the first few hours the convention seemed to run quite smoothly, but somewhat quieter than before, much to our puzzlement, it was then discovered that the bar could not open until 7:00 as the club was not granted its usual Sunday license; it has to be said that a good skinful is generally needed to really let yourself go that early on a Sunday, so it was no real surprise that things didn't liven up until after 7:00. One rather surprised guy (Nathaniel Tatam) was awarded a pair of Dave Gahan's autographed leather boots for being the only person brave enough to dance, (nice one Nathaniel!)

This was my first convention from the other side of the fence so I got the

pleasure of throwing some of the goodies into the crowd, a good way of making friends and enemies quickly! Sorry to everyone at the back of the crowd. Paper doesn't generally fly too far, but we tried! As you all probably noticed there were fewer giveaways this year than at previous conventions, unfortunately Mute Record's stock of promo posters, etc. were drained as a result of the Birmingham conventions and with the band in the studio recording there was nothing in the way of new promotional items. (Jo promises to make up for this at. the next Bong Convention later this year) Among the things that were given away were a strategically thrown selection of posters that were autographed by the band so the giveaways weren't so bad after all.

No-one could have anticipated the huge response to the Mastermind competition and hundreds entered the first heat with only a handful of entrants going through to the second heat.

In fact, the questions (set by Roland Brown at Mute Records) proved to be so difficult that there were only two heats rather than three. It was finally down to only two finalists who had to answer Depeche Mode questions on

stage. The ultimate winner was Simone Teeling from Holland who won a signed Music For The Masses Gold disc and the runner-up wasfrom.....who won a signed, framed poster.

As usual, there was a look-a-like competition, won by 20 year-old Alex Moore from London as "Fletch", he won a signed crew shirt from the *Music For The Masses* Tour. Alan was Steve Beaumontaged 25 from Stoke—Steve's prize was a *Recoil* promo 12" signed by Alan. Dave was Stefan Devillers from Belgium who won a large leather holdall bag signed by David, and which has travelled all over the World with him. Finally, David Roundell from Oswaldtwistle was Martin and he won a signed jacket.

Coercion were due to go on at 7:00, so I suddenly got very nervous and disappeared into the dressing room with Jon and Simon, the other two band members. We were going to perform soon—sober!

Modesty prevents me from reviewing the live set, so I'll pass over to Lynn:

I've never seen three paler faces in my life—despite the smattering of make up which was applied to counteract the bright lights. I'm not surprised they were nervous, they were about to play their first-ever gig, performing a mixture of original songs and Mode covers—in front of hundreds of Mode fans—not something I personally would relish.

Jo went onto the Stage and announced them and the audience looked on expectantly, after all, there'd never been a live band at a convention before. After an initial hiccup Coercion opened their set with "A Question Of Time". We were pretty relieved when the crowd started to enjoy themselves straight-away—as someone said to us afterwards—"We (the fans) were worried that they'd spoil the DM stuff, but they we're really good. The other Mode covers performed by the band were: "Halo", "World Full Of Nothing" (an acapella version), "Enjoy The Silence" and an encore of "Behind The Wheel" /"Route 66". There were four original Coercion songs in the set; "Replace Your Heart", "Reality", "Repeat To Fade' and "Believe Me.". All in all, the idea of harmyper wated by as Welly teceived so we'll demively do it again in the future.

Bootleas & Di Remixes

1) Music for the Masses Format: Video Origin: Unknown

This Video bootleg was recorded in KÖln on 6/11/87. It includes the entire concert with Front 242 as support. The picture and sound quality are fairly good. You see the video from the right side of the stage that gives a good view. Sometimes, however, the head of an enthusiastic fan bobs in front of the camera.

2) Amsterdam 83 Format: CD Origin: Unknown

This bootleg should be of the concert on 6/12/83 in Amsterdam, but it isn't! The CD is really the concert from the 24 or 25, October 1982 in London. The cover is excellent, but the sound quality is not so good. Buy it, only if you like it.

3) A Question of Knowledge Format: LP Origin: Unknown

This bootleg was recorded in Rotterdam on 28/3/82, London on 25/10/82, in Glasgow on 21/2/82 and in London on 6/10/83. The cover is very good and the sound quality too. It was worth what I paid for it.

Thomas Loschke Germany.

1) A Break in Stuttgart Format: CD Origin: Germany

This is a recording of a gig held in the Martin Schleyer Hall on October 15, 1991. A limited edition of 1000 copies that contain the best 14 songs of the concert. The quality is excellent. This CD is very interesting because there is an interruption on the playback of "Shake the Disease" and Dave has to sing vocals with the help of the audience, although one guy shouts "Money back!"

Sebastian Sinterhauf
Germany

1) DJ's Revenge, Downtown Records

Format: CD Origin: USA

This CD contains rare mixes of 12 songs from over the years with a total running time of 72:22. "Photographic," "Personal Jesus," "Just Can't Get Enough," "Dangerous," and "A Question of Time" are some of the songs included. All the mixes are great, except Little 15 (Bogus Brothers Mix) which has a hip-hop beat added. It totally wipesout the feeling of the song. Over all it is worth what I paid for it.

2) Ultra Rare Trax Format: CD Origin: Unknown

The people responsible for the release of this CD is not stated on the cover. It contains 12 songs, some of them are; "Master/Set Me Free," "Halo," "World In My Eyes," "Policy of Truth," and 2 versions of "Death's Door"—Take 1 and Take 2. The mixing is excellent which is a shame because the sound quality is terrible; an annoying buzz is audible during the whole recording and only stops in between tracks. I paid £20.00 and consider myself to be ripped off. Don't buy this unless you can "cure" the sound.

Michael Sanden Address not included

1) The Classic Techno Mixes, Depeche Mode, Volume 2 Format: CD Origin: Unknown

Track listing: "Just Can't Get Enough" (Mastermix), "Master & Servant (Hammerhead Mix), Nothing (Art of Mix), "Route 66 (Nile Rodgers Remix), "Never Let Me Down" (Groovy Mix), "World In My Eyes" (Mixx-Rite Remix), "Photogenic" (Remix), "Death mix" (Remix), and "The Official Megamix." The price was quite good, it wasn't that more expensive than you pay for a usual CD and the sound quality was excellent too. However, I don't think that the mixes were all that original.

2) The Third Strike Format: CD Origin: Unknown

This is a promo CD that contains: "Enjoy The Silence" (Indefinite Mix), "But Not Tonight" (Margouleff Mix), "Strangelove" (Joseph Watt Remix), "New Dress" (Razormaid), "World In My Eyes" (Mayhem Mode Mix), "Everything Counts" (Alan Moulder Mix), "Route 66 (Nile Rodgers Mix), "Behind The Wheel" (DJ Remix Edit), "Photographic" (ON-USound Remix), "I Sometimes Wish I Was Dead" (ON-USound Remix). The sound quality is excellent except for the last two tracks, which have a slight rustle. In spite of that, buy it. The running time is 71 minutes approx. It cost me £16.00.

1) Wonderworld. BKCD 016 Format: CD Origin: UK.

Tracks 1-12 were recorded live in Amsterdam at the Paradisco Club on June 20, 1981, 13-18, unknown. the sound quality is very good for the price—that of an average CD. The packaging includes great pictures from the World Violation Tour and on the CD itself Dave's head is printed in different shades of green. It's a beautiful piece!

1) Strangelove Promo 12" Scan by Mat 12" Cl blue vinyl Origin: UK

This contains the officially released "Blind Mix" on the A-side and the "Fresh Ground Mix," remixed by Phil Harding, on the B-side. The latter is very interesting—but equally strange with some bizarre cut-outs and samples. The catalogue number reads DANCE BONG 13, but no record company is printed. The record has a great sound and is presented in a yellow cover. I paid £17.00 for it.

Michael Toft Denmark

1) Innocent And Vain Format: Cassette Origin: Unknown

This is a live recording from the Hammersmith Palais in—I think—1982. The cover consists of 2 1/2 pictures of Alan at the top, Andy in the middle and half of Martin at the bottom—all on keyboards. All photocopied from a Smash Hits interview. I think the copy I have is a recording of the original bootleg, and it is very poor quality. Although it was quite cheap (around £3-£4), if you ever pick it up, put it down again!

This is a cover version of Patti Smith's hit - "Because The Night," by Co. Ro. and Features samples taken from "Master & Servant". Very professionally mixed with great sound and a good beat. If you ever find this record, buy it!

1) A Tower Of Glory Format: VHS/PAL video Origin: Sweden

This is a 6-track video recorded during the *Music For The Masses* Tour in Stookholm on February 12, 1988. It contains "Pimpf," "Behind The Wheel," "Strangelove," "Sacred," "Something To Do," and "Blasphemous Rumours". The picture is quite good, but not very sharp. Sometimes you can only see the roof. The sound quality is very good and the video is worth buying if you can ever get your hands on it. It's a numbered edition, limited to about 50 copies only and it comes in a black and white photocopied sleeve.

2) New Mode Format: LP Origin: UK

This record is from the *Speak & Spell* Tour and was recorded in Manchester on November 3, 1981. It includes all songs from *Speak & Spell* plus Television Set, "Dreaming Of Me," and "Ice Machine." The sound quality is quite good but it runs a bit slow. The sleeve is excellent and it's a good record if you like *Speak & Spell*.

3) Toys

Format: LP Origin: Unknown

Toys is available in a pink/cerise colour sleeve and in a second edition black/grey one, and finally as a picture disc. Toys contains 16 songs and was recorded in Glasgow in 1982. The sound quality is very good, and if you can get hold of the pink sleeve one don't let it get away!

4) Live 82 MX

Format: 7" EP Origin: Portugal

This is a 5-track out-take from Toys. It's available in a pink/cerise or black/grey sleeve. If you already have Toys, you won't need this one.

7) Live in Europe Volume 1 & 2 Format: 2 LP Origin: Unknown

These were two of the first DM bootlegs available. The two records include an entire show recorded in Lund, Sweden in 1984. The original sleeve is red/yellow/black and the sound quality is very good even though there are no drums on "New Life." This show is also available as a double album under the name Photographic in a very nice sleeve.

5) Boys Say Go Format: LP Origin - Germany.

This is one of my favourites. It was recorded somewhere in Germany in 1982 and contains 16 songs from *Speak & Spell* and *A Broken Frame* plus "Television Set" and "I Like It." The sound quality is quite good and the sleeve is excellent. This is worth buying.

6) Tomorrow's Dance Format: LP Origin - USA

This is one of the many recordings from the show at the Hammersmith Odeon in 1982, although the sleeve says Amsterdam '83. It contains 12 songs. The sound quality is very good and so is the original sleeve. The second edition was released in a plain colour jacket.

8) Just Can't Get Enough Format: LP Origin: Germany

This is the first record from Basel, Switzerland on 30/11/84. The set includes the whole show except for the intro. and half of the first song. The sound quality is very good. A record worth buying.

9) Be A Part Of It Format: LP Origin: Unknown

This is a copy of the BBC recorded show at the Hammersmith Odeon during the *Some Great Reward Tour*. The sound quality is as excellent as the sleeve looks. This is absolutely worth buying.

10) Perfect Pop Format: LP Origin: France

This is a record from the Torhout festival in Belgium on July 6, 1985. Do It If You Want (reviewed in BONG 16) might be a copy, but this is the original. The sleeve is one of the best I've seen.

11) In Edits

Format: 2 LP Origin: UK

This record contains all the commercially released live songs except "Master & Servant." It also includes the limited edition remix version of "Flexible." The sleeve is quite good and the sound quality is struction standard. If you have all the officially released 12" singles you won't need this one.

12) Time After Time Format: 2 LP Schight Daudy

This is a record from the Music For The Masses Tour, and includes the entire show except the intro. It was recorded at Wembly Arena, January 11, 1988. The sound quality is not good, but the sleeve is excellent. Don't buy this unless you have more money than sense.

13) A Question Of Time Format: 3 LP Origin: Unknown

This is a recording from the Westfalenhalle, Dortmund on 22/5/86. The entire concert is on one blue and two clear discs. The sleeve is absolutely excellent and the sound is very good too. This record can be quite expensive, but I think it's worth it.

14) See You/ Boys Say Go! Format: 7" Origin: USA

This is an out-take from Everything Counts (L12 BONG 3). As the complete songs aren't included you need not buy this ugly-sleeved 2 track record.

Johan Ostberg Sweden



1) The Second Strike Format: CD Origin: Germany

This compilation, seemingly a followup to DJ's Revenge, contains ten DJ only remixes, although the label states that there are eleven tracks. The omitted track is the Margouleff Remix of "But Not Tonight from the US Sire 12". Seven of the ten tracks are from Razormaid mixed by Joseph Watt and / or Art Maharg. In all, this CD is well worth adding to your collection, with excellent sound quality—except the mix of "Halo." The Razormaid mixes of the tracks from Violator are really intense, with interesting samples tossed in, from Kraftwerk and Enya to bits of other DM songs.

2) We Make You Dance (Studio Dubs)

Format: LP Origin: Germany

I found this 1986 release at a small store in Boston in 1987, and in the two years I lived in Germany, I never saw another copy, so this item is seemingly quite rare. The packaging is enticing, with various "arty" photos of models on the front and photos of the band on the back. This is merely a front for a cheaply mixed, although with decent sound quality mega-dub of various pre-1985 Mode songs montaged with other songs from artists as varied as Bronski Beat, Yazoo, Chaka Khan, Miami Sound Machine, and even Ray Parker Jr.'s theme from Ghostbusters. Each side of this white-labeled, red vinyl 12" plays at a different speed, with side 1 playing at 45rpm and side 2 at 33 1/3 rpm. Don't be fooled into buying this unless you are certain you really, really want

3) Dreaming Of A New Life Format: 2 LP Origin: Germany

This bootleg is a recording of the 1986 performance of DM at the Roskilde Festival and at first may seem like a good buy, with its really nice packaging, but BUYER BEWARE! The packaging is excellent, with a double 12" gatefold containing several nice pictures of the band along with some artdeco graphics, and a blatant enticement stating that the first 200 copies were on colored vinyl, leading you to believe that you're purchasing a real collector's item. The sound quality is extremely poor, and you hear the screaming girls next to the recording microphone singing along much better than you can hear the band. Avoid this recording at all costs. I wouldn't even wish a bootleg this poor on my worst enemy. Even if I had got a coloured-vinyl copy it still couldn't sway my position.

1) The Classic Techno Mixes, Depeche Mode, Volume 1 Format: CD Origin: Unknown

This compilation CD was released by Techno Classics DJ Service in 1992. It contains 4 old megamixes: "Classic Modes Megamix" which has some very shredded and interesting samples worked into it, "Mega Mode 1" and "Mega Mode 2," which are both fairly pathetic, and my favourite, "Celebration Megamix," which is very intriguing because it features almost every song on the "Black Celebration" album. There is a bonus track on the CD called "Blasphemous Dreams," but it's really the old Discotrax mix of "Dreaming of Me." The packaging is very professional looking, with robotics figures that are very reminiscent of Kraftwerk illustrations.

2) Razormaid Class X One Format: CD Origin: USA

Includes a remix of "NoDisco" which isokay, but the original song was pretty crappy anyway. There are also some good remixes of Yazoo's "Don't Go," New Order's "Blue Monday," and other tunes. Packaged in a yellow cardboard sleeve.

3) Razormaid Chapter Three: The Mastering Room

Format: 12" orange vinyl Origin: USA

Includes a medley of "Master & Servant" and "(Set Me Free) Remotivate Me" called "Master... Set Me Free!" It's okay, but nothing to really have a fit about. There are three other tracks, including Tears for Fear's "Mothers Talk." The cover is awesome, with a young lady in a leather outfit with a whip and a black vinyl record.

4) Razormaid: Anniversary Six Point Zero

Format:2 LP green marbled vinyl Origin: USA

Includes a fantastic remix of "People are People," featuring samples from "Dub in My Eyes," the "Twin Peaks" soundtrack, and even Robert Smith screaming! Along with this track are several wonderful mixes of classic tunes by Peter Schilling and Micro Chip League and predesty for the ety Medley! It has any bite, and blue cover that is rather boring.

5) Razormaid d9

Scan Egranatic CD Origin: USA


Includes a marvellous mix of "Sea of Sin." The mix has a sample of Enya's "Orinoco flow (Sail Away)" in it, which is a horrible-sounding concept, but it works really well. Nothing else on the CD really amazes me, though. It's got a blue insert with a huge yellow "d" on the front.

6) A New Position Format: 2 LP Origin: Unknown

Not the best of recordings, but certainly one of the best looking and most amusing. The concert is the November 19, 1990 Wembely Arena show. The frontcover photo is of DM laying down on a stairway. The back cover is a black & white photo of Martin's chest, with the words "ForSexualReliefOnly, NOT for resale" in white. The labels of the records have very funny nicknames for the songs, such as "Peter Sellers" instead of "Strangelove."

7) Everything Counts Format: 2 LP Origin: USA

A pretty good recording of the San Diego show from July 31st, 1990. Some tracks are missing, such as "Little 15." The cool thing about this one is it is one of very few recordings that contains the acoustic version of "Blue Dress." The cover is OK, with three roses.



1) DJ Promo 5 Format: 12" Origin: Unknown

No title or recording company takes credit on the label for this remix record. The only noticeable marking is a large 5 and the words DJ Promo Only. The first side is a very poor "Little 15" remix which is nothing more than the single drown out by a drum machine. The second side is a very similar destruction of "I Want You Now". The recording is very poor.

2) Get Into the Mode Format: 12" Origin: Unknown

The record has a red label with a "fat side" containing the Mode mix and a "lean side" called "A Sweet Test For You", having nothing to do with Mode. Get Into the Mode is a poorly edited remix of "Little 15" with samples from "Never Let Me Down Again". The recording is so poor the vocals sound like a poor bootleg.

3) Mixophone New Mode Mega 90/ Mode Megamix Format: 12"

Format: 12" Origin: USA

This pair of well done megamixes were released by Disco Motion records. The New Mode Mega 90 pulls vocals and samples from every song on Violator in addition to "Dangerous", "Just Can't Get Enough" and even some live samples from London 1982. The track runs for over 16 minutes. The Mode Megamix is a weaker attempt to mix "Never Let Me Down Again", "Just Can't Get Enough", "Everything Counts", "People are People" and several others.

4) Razormaid Ultra Hot Razor Disc 2

Format: CD Origin: USA

This Razormaid compilation CD contains an "Enjoy the Silence" remix called the "Triad Mix" by John M. Pillin Jr. In addition to uniquely combining many of the commercial remixes as in "The Quad Final Mix" he adds a great mix of the "Harmonium Mix" along with some well blended samples of the violin solo.

1) Sweetest Violation Format: 2 LP Origin: Unknown

The cover is well done! The pictures are from the 1990 tour book and are used to make the cover look professional or authorized. The recording is from the Copenhagen gig on 2/10/90. It includes all 22 songs of the set. Martin's solo acoustic set includes "Sweetest Perfection", "Here is the House", "I Want You Now" and "World Full Of Nothing". The sound quality is good for a bootleg—not totally clear though.

2) Live at Dodger Stadium Format 2 LP Origin: USA

This bootleg is not worth the \$24.99 (American) I paid for it. It includes 19 tracks (1 unlisted) plus the introduction from the 8-4-90 show at Dodger Stadium. It has poor sound quality although some tracks are okay.

3) Depeche Mode Live from Hot Shots

Format: 1 LP Origin: USA

This bootleg is from the *Broken Frame* tour and has okay quality sound. Important to note, the live tracks are from the special series of "Love, In Itself", "Everything Counts" and "Get The Balance Right" singles. The official releases are better sounding and have tracks which are not missing from the bootleg. There are 12 tracks total and it cost me \$10.99 (Canadian).


4) Depeche Mode Live '82 Format: CD Origin: USA

The name of this bootleg unknown, but its the same as "Hot Shots" although the sound is better.

5) Black Moderation Format 2 LP Origin: Germany

This bootleg is from the Music For The Masses Tour recorded in Gothenburg in 1988. Almost exactly the same as 101 exceptitis missing 1 or 2 tracks (namely "Somebody" which is replaced by "Pipeline"). The sound is not too good but okay in some parts.

Many people have written to us about a so-called "Mute Promo" of "Death's Door". This is a White label 12" with the catalogue number PPBONG21. It features four mixes: "Blue Angel Mix," "Atmosphere Mix," "Joy Mix," and "Berlin Mix." THIS IS NOT A LEGITIMATE MUTE PROMOTIONAL RECORD. It is a coun-


not endorsed its release in any way. If you do see any copies on sale, please contact us. They sell for between twenty and thirty pounds and we've been told that the quality is appalling. The same group of people are also marketing a number of Erasure remixes in the same manner. Please do not be taken in by these con men.

If you're into collecting promos you'll want to get the US CD and vinyl PRO's from the three box sets. There are two CD's, PRO-CD-5192 and PRO-CD-5242, and two vinyl editions, PRO-A-5192 and PRO-A-5242. The vinyl editions contain two discs each and feature Extended 12"'s and B-sides, and the CD's feature 7" singles and B-sides.

Even if you don't collect a lot of DM records but you've always wanted to have a good collection of singles and B-sides on CD and Vinyl without having to buy every one, look for these until you find them.

Finally, if you have sent in a request for the International Depeche Mode discography and are wondering if we forgot about your request we would like to ask you to please be patient with us as we are still in the process of sorting and organizing our data. It has taken much longer than we expected to get the project finished, but we hope to have it done within the next few months. Sire Records have at last decided that Depeche Mode's fans in the United States should have the opportunity to own the final four singles from the box set. I'm talking about "Strangelove", "Never Let Me Down Again," "Behind The Wheel," and "Everything Counts" (Live) on CD format. CD's number 19, 20, 21 and 22 respectively.

These CD's are very much complete when compared to the German CD singles. Each one comes with an average of 7 to 8 tracks. CD number 21 ("Behind The Wheel") features the Remix of "Behind The Wheel" which was previously unreleased in the US and the UK, except on the promotional UK 7". The track listings are as follows:

21) Behind The Wheel-Remix, Route 66, Behind The Wheel-Shep Pettibone Remix, Route 66-Beatmasters Mix, Behind The Wheel-Beatmasters Mix, Route 66-Casualty Mix, Behind The Wheel-LP. Mix 22) Everything Counts-Live (101 Singles), Nothing-Live, Sacred-Live, A Question of Lust-Live, Everything Counts-TimSimeron/Mark Saunders Remix, Strangelove-Tim Simeron/Mark Saunders Remix, Everything Counts-Absolute Mix.

So there you have them, the final four CDs that were missing from the Box Sets. now the fans in the US can also own the first 22 DM Singles without paying high import prices.

Editor's note. The first 18 singles, originally released as box sets 1,2,& 3, have also been released as individual CD singles in the States. The CD's are still numbered 1-18, but they are now packaged in Digipaks.
