

EVERYTHING. COUNTS

Martin got back to work after the New Year and has been busy writing songs for inclusion on the long awaited double CD package due out in October 98.

While Martin was busy song-writing, Fletch spent the last two weeks of January on holiday in Mauritius. Dave stayed at home taking things easy, and looking forward to getting back to work soon.

The Band met in London early February to discuss their plans and ideas for the rest of this year and the good news is that they are going into **the studio** sometime this month (March) to begin work on the new material together with Tim Simenon, who is once again in charge of production.

The double CD set will include all the **Band's hits** since 1986, along with a couple of new songs, the title of this compilation is still to be confirmed. There will be a new single coming out in September. So watch this space for more info!

We have one more great piece of news.....it is now almost certain that Depeche Mode will embark on a **World Tour**, starting in September. It is also quite likely that the European and US legs of this tour will be completed before the end of the year!

We are also going to find out how we can make it possible for BONG members to get good **tickets** when shows go on sale. However, please don't write to us yet, because we have no details at this stage.

General

"Just Can't Get Enough" was one of the songs performed by Erasure during their Christmas concert at the Manchester Academy.

Recording artist Tricky along with Martina Topley Bird remade the DM song "Judas" on the CD "Nearly God" (1996) by Island Independent Records.

The German synth-pop group Diesel Christ released another CD. It features "Ultra" covers and is called 'Diesel Mode 97'.

You probably already know this, but Depeche Mode's "Route 66" (The Nile Rodgers Mix) was featured on a brilliant soundtrack to the movie called 'Earth Girls Are Easy' back in 1989. The musical compilation to this movie, directed by Julien Temple, also includes tracks by Daryl Hall & John Oates, The B-52's, The Jesus And Mary Chain and Julie Brown among many others.


"Ultra" has been voted one of the 50 best albums of 1997 by Q Magazine (January'98 issue).

"Ultra" reached the 17th position among the best selling albums of 1997 in Germany.

In the show called '50:1' on MTV (50 hits to 1 theme), "It's No Good" reached No. 4 in the category 'Best British Artists' (21.11.97) and No. 2 in 'The Most Stylish Video' (12.12.97).

On January 1, a show on German music TV Viva called 'The Best of 1997' featured an interview with the Band and an excerpt of "It's No Good" (live) recorded at the Ultra party in London last year.







"It's No Good" reached the 50th position in 'The Best Of 1997' Chart on the local radio station RMI FM in Poznan, Poland.

Back in September, "It's No Good" reached No. 50 on MTV's 'Top 100 Weekend of the 90s', followed by No. 33 on MTV's 'Top 100 Weekend 1997' on December 20-21.

"Enjoy The Silence" was used in the TV movie called 'Eine Urgehursame Frau' on German TV ZDF on January 5th.

In the movie "Selena" starring Jennifer Lopez, they played about a minute of "Policy of Truth" in one significant scene. It was not, however, included on the soundtrack album.

On Sunday 7th December, "Home" was used by the European TV Channel Euronews as background music for a report on fashion.

RTL-TV1, a Belgian private TV station celebrated it's 10th Anniversary

in September 1997, and a special report was broadcast showing the evolution of the station between 1987 and 1997, using "People Are People" as background music.

The German channel Sat.1 used "Barrel Of A Gun" to promote a thriller called 'Tod im Labor' on December 13, 1997.

MTV has been using musical segments of "BOAG" and "Useless" for their Top 20 countdown.

"The Love Thieves", "A Question Of Time", "Barrel Of A Gun" and "Painkiller" were played several times on the French TV channel M6 in the programmes 'Zone Interdite', 'Mister Bizz' and 'Capital'.

On January 5th the German TV-Channel ZDF used an extract from "Enjoy the Silence" as background music in the film 'Eine ungehorsame Frau' while a mother was showing her daughter how to use a condom !!!

On September 3, the German TV station RTL showed a report about the safety of cars in Germany in a programme called 'Stern TV' using snippets of "Barrel Of A Gun".

In Berlin, 'The Love Parade 1997' had a 'Love Parade Special' on the radio station '98.8 KISS FM' during which 60 famous DJs played their favourites for one hour. One of the acts was Marusha and she played "It's No Good" (Club 69 Future Mix).

"Barrel Of A Gun" is being used as background music in a spot for a programme 'Downtown' on German music channel Viva 2.

"The Love Thieves" was used in its entirety during an American TV show called 'La Femme Nikita' on the USA Network on January 9, 1998.

"Home" was played during Germany's RTL2 series called 'Alle Zusammen - Jeder Fürsich' on August 8th.

On January 12, "Home" (Grantby Mix) was used in a programme about football called 'Il processo di Biscardi' on the Italian TV Channel TMC, during an analysis of Italian soccer championships.

On August 24th, "It's No Good" was played during the show called 'Motorsport' on the German TV station DSF.

On 19th September, the German TV sport station DSF used "Photographic" as background music for a programme called 'Motobike'.

Editor's note: Our kindest regards to the TV Crew of the German channel DSF who are so fond of Depeche Mode they have used DM tracks on their shows in three consecutive months.

"Nothing" was played during a programme 'Akte 97/98' on German TV Sat 1 on December 30.

The whole version of "Useless" was used as background music during a report about agencies selling deserted islands on the French TV channel TF1 on December 3.

During the night of 25th December, the Italian TV Channel TMC2 showed a special broadcast on Depeche Mode, U2 and Litfiba (an Italian band). The special which started at 10pm and finished at about 6am featured a large number of DM videoclips and live performances.

The instrumental version of "Home" is regularly featured on the 'Sky Sports' programme 'Golf Extra'. It is used for background music when introducing various items and statistics.

On December 12, an excerpt of "Barrel Of A Gun" was used during a trailer of the movie 'Hydrotoxin' on the Austrian TV Channel ORF 2.

This is a story of how I met my favourite band Depeche Mode, an experience I'll never forget. So let's begin...

It all started in 1985. I was just 12 years old and I was listening to the song "Shake The Disease". It was No. 1 at the 'Hey Music' radio chart. I was really overwhelmed by the outstanding sound of the track. Although I already knew songs like "People Are People" or "Master And Servant" this was the time I really noticed Depeche Mode and have adored their music ever since. I became one of the biggest DM fans...

I also have to mention that I lived in East Berlin at the time and could move to West Berlin with my mom only on a special exit permit. It was in July 1986 when the Berlin Wall still sat in the middle of the city. Unfortunately we moved over about three months too late so I missed the "Black Celebration" Tour at the Berliner Waldbühne. I had to wait for the "Music For The Masses" Tour. Depeche Mode announced that they were going to have a concert in Berlin on November 9, 1987, just two days after their show in Hannover. I thought that the band would probably arrive in Berlin in between these two concerts.

On 8th November I got up early in the morning and went to the hotel Intercontinental. There were about 30 DM fans already waiting in front of it. At around 10am we suddenly saw a DM crew bus and so we run after it as we thought the Band might be in there. Wrong! A guy with the DM hat (a crew member) told us Depeche Mode were not in Berlin yet and so I decided together with three other fans to go to the Berlin-Tegel Airport. I looked for the gates of arriving airplanes from Hannover. I had waited for about five hours when I suddenly saw Martin coming out of Gate 3 at 3.40pm. I was just standing there with a big smile in my face. I didn't know what to do as I couldn't believe I was face to face to my idols. I am sure Martin noticed how I felt - my joy and happiness. He smiled at me. Just everyone in Depeche Mode were very nice to the fans. The good thing was that there were only about six fans and so the Band members had time to give the fans some autographs. When the Band

walked to their bus I had a chance (for the second time) to ask Alan and Dave for their signatures.

The next day I finally saw them live (for the first time) in concert at the Deutschlandhalle. I was standing in the first row and I am positive that Alan recognised me from the day before because when I waved at him he smiled back. The concert itself was amazing. I can't put it in words...

So thank you Depeche Mode for making my dream come true when I was 'Little 15'....that's how Depeche Mode became (a part of) my life.

On April 25, 1997, I was in Stockholm to see Depeche Mode performing live on TV 4's 'En kvall med Luuk'. Before the show, I was lucky to meet the band outside the TV studio. Dave and Andy gave me their autographs, but unfortunately I couldn't get Martin's because he went inside too quickly.

A few hours later, Depeche Mode performed "It's No Good" with live vocals. Christian Eigner was there playing drums, not Dave Clayton. It was a great (but too short) show with only 200 people in the audience.

"Strange" is the first video compilation directed by Anton Corbijn. It contains five excellent videos from "Black Celebration" and "Music For The Masses". As "Black Celebration" seems to be a musical change in the Band's career, Corbijn's black and white imagery may signify another twist in the visuals. Before each of the videos we're introduced to some sort of guides who seem to be living in the 'Depeche Mode Museum'. This also gives us a feeling of a proper movie rather than a compilation of the separate videos. The tape starts off with "A Question Of Time" which is unfortunately the only track from "Black Celebration". Then there comes "Strangelove". It seems as if

the videos were linked up in a chronological order, developing a story on its own. Take this example - Dave has a car accident in "Never Let Me Down Again", then in "Behind The Wheel", he gets picked up and his car is towed away. Additionally, Anton is very good combining the lyrics with the images....then Ippolita indeed seems to be "Behind The Wheel". The final track is "Pimpf" where the rough nature of the minimal story perfectly fits the dramatic mood of the music. Finally, there are Depeche Mode destroying their own museum. Martin perfectly captures Anton's provoking images emphasising the sombre atmosphere of songs like "Never Let Me Down Again" by saying: "Anton feels our music..." To conclude, this piece of work based on love or life or lust or nothing in particular', definitely is a pioneer in a row of the following videos and a must for all fans.



With the benefit of hindsight it is easy to criticise pre-Corbijn Depeche Mode videos as bland, as so many early 80s promos were (need we dwell on Pinky and Perky and Dave's 'mince pies' in "The Meaning Of Love"?). But with "Strange" it is obvious that the band had chosen to take greater care with the preparation, storyboarding,

and execution of their visuals, and Anton Corbijn's dark cinematic vision proved pivotal for the direction of future DM videos. Each "Strange" video assumes a sinister and threatening quality due to the effective usage of grainy b/w Super 8 film in atmospheric locations in the USA and Europe: from (the, perhaps, incongruous) "A Question Of Time", through "Strangelove", "Never Let Me Down Again" (Split Mix), "Behind The Wheel", and the final approaching menace of "Pimpf". The songs on "Strange" are linked by surreal inserts detailing the loss of a dog, Dave's 'childhood' on a farm, and the joys

of driving Dave 'anywhere' on a scooter bike. These links are never superfluous and Rebecca, Ippolita and Valdemar (Dave's 'best friend') help unite the songs into a surreal, hypnotic, and compelling whole. I find it impossible to watch any one of the videos individually, such is the power with which they are all bonded. It is all or nothing at all with "Strange". "Strange" sets an important precedent for future DM videos. (No disrespect to D.A.Pennebaker, but I wonder how different, and darker, "101" would have been with Anton Corbijn at the helm.) Ten years since its release the film is still wonderfully atmospheric and has achieved a kind of timelessness.

Somehow the sequel did not reach the same level. Strange!

"Strange" is not a simple collection of promotional videos. Anton Corbijn managed to turn this 30 minutes compilation of videos into a highly artistic short film. The thread of the five pieces is the museum where we are introduced to various characters who tell their little stories of meeting Depeche Mode. The presentation of these people is dark and bare, and so is the new image of the band. Much more European than it unfortunately got to be afterwards. Corbijn's talent here reaches the very top, at least, at the time. "A Question Of Time" is shot on the roads of 'grey lit' Los Angeles (so dissimilar to Pennebaker's one). "Strangelove" is set in Paris and Corbijn shoots in his deeply personal fashion again. At last he brings in a marvellous 'grainy' film with the strong black and white contrasts. The video reveals taste for the fashion fetishism, which was absolutely avant-garde at the time. The masterpiece is "Never Let Me Down Again", shot in Denmark, in which every image takes towards you story's dramatic final. The band's acting also deserves

a mention here. In the second 'Split Mix' part, we find some old David Lynch-esque atmosphere which might feel a little bit disconnected from the part one. "Behind The Wheel" is the presumed sequel of "Never Let Me Down Again", set in some cold Italian village. The images nicely match the ambiguous lyrics of the song. The compilation is closed by "Pimpf", set in a Spanish desert, where the museum is finally destroyed. The only thing to be added is that "Strange" is the BEST and UNEQUALLED Depeche Mode video, and it is essential for every DM fan and every visual art judge.

The "101" video/film is a truly great road movie, made up of live action footage of the band's 101 dates across the USA, finishing up at the Pasadena's Rose Bowl. For one week the band were accompanied by the winners of a radio competition and the camera managed to capture the fly on the wall arguments, problems, traumas and celebrations from both, the band and the competition winners, who missed one of the shows down to Dave, the bus driver, with his navigation skills, which are questionable throughout the film. The live footage of the band on stage is cut and arranged for the song titles to fit into what's happening in the


film. Every song is outstanding, there's not a duff one in here. Dave's energy and stage presence, with the rest of the band, makes a cracking good show. With the video weighing in at 117 mins, it does start to wane towards the end. But for the devotees, it is a perfect cornerstone in the band's career. A 10/10 performance.

"A film about music, those who sell it and those who buy it" booms D.A.Pennebaker from "101" programme. "Master and servant". But which is which...? Um..."101" doesn't answer that question; instead it follows Depeche Mode from concert to concert, using candid backstage footage the same way Pennebaker's "Don't Look Back" did. And it has the added oddness of a bunch of American teenagers who've won a be-in-a-Mode-film contest and are on a bus journey to see Depeche Mode. This being verity, the fans miss most of the show they're supposed to go to, and they only meet Alan Wilder. They drink a lot and are very cute, though. Likewise, Depeche Mode. Sample conversation between Dave Gahan and a tour manager. Gahan: "I don't think I should say 'Hello, Pasadena', I think I should say, 'Hello, the Rosebowl'...I don't know." Tour manager: "Why don't you just

say 'Good evening, everybody in the Rosebowl tonight'"? Gahan: "I'm not f***ing Wordsworth, you know." Depeche Mode do restrained on-the-road things like buying guitars and doing radio interviews. Gahan confesses to duffing up a mad cabbie. "An'he got out the cab and he was this big! an'then his trousers fell down!" Gore says not a word. The fans dance in their bus and Pennebaker gives us some crotch shots. Very clever. The live footage is neat and very loud; Depeche Mode are a proper stadium band, except they don't have guitar solos (they do have a tasty version of "Route 66"

though). Mostly the last two LPs are performed, with an awesome joyful version of "Just Can't Get Enough" to remind us why America bought them in the first place. And there's "Everything Counts"...In one of the tackiest bits of cinematic irony ever, we cut from a gross scene involving concessions owners gloating and shouting "We made a lot of money! We made a load of money!" Into "Everything Counts". Coo! Does Pennebaker mean to say that people get rich out of pop music? There's also an earlier scene where Gahan claims to have been happier stacking shelves in a supermarket. "You lose your friends, you're away from home

doing this", he mumbles. "But you get more money..." which then cuts into the cute teenagers the difference discussing between commercial art and starving-garret art. I suppose it's hard making points with flyon-the-wall naturalism techniques; people simply don't say anything profound enough. Strangely, whenever the Mode are backstage, they're alone where are the millions of liggers and journos who accompany tours: "101" is a stripped and censored version of a tour" however, as a film of a group at work, it's immensely less irritating than the U2 one and, if it doesn't show why America quite likes Depeche Mode, it shows that they aren't the redneck Brucers fools like Morrissey would have us believe. The music is fine, too, and those teenagers are very cute.



Apart from the live performances, "101" also features many interesting moments from behind the scene, such as Alan explaining the keys in "Black Celebration" on his keyboard, Dave singing unplugged, Fletch and Martin in the studio of the radio station and more. This is definitely music for the masses, especially if you experienced this tour yourself.

What is Depeche Mode? Can anyone pin-point the group's identity from the past couple of years? Maybe the idea is not to be pigeon-holed.

Each new album has heralded a new era of design ideas. The out-of-focus photographs from the "Violator" single sleeves, along with the single rose, the mythical bird-woman from "Songs Of Faith And Devotion", and various megaphones speakers in "Music For The Masses". But is there an identifiable emblem or symbol that signifies Depeche Mode?

Many heavy rock bands (AC/DC, ZZ Top, Queen, Aerosmith) have long

standing logos that appear repeatedly from album to album. Similarly The Carpenters, Oasis and The Beatles logo name has remained the same. Check many of Phil Collins' record sleeves. Then there are the associated logos - The Rolling Stones' tongue, and the ELO roundel.

What does Depeche Mode have? A mixed bag of letter styles and images gathered over the years and no real identity that can be singularly identified. Maybe that's the way it should be to illustrate the dramatic changes that have taken place since those early synth-pop days. On the other hand, couldn't fan club members be encouraged to design an 'all encompassing Depeche Mode' design? Something that would reflect what Depeche Mode means to us all in a single image? I'd like to bet that a single red rose is a common theme.







This CD contains a collection of the B-Side following tracks: 16 "Dangerous", "Happiest Girl", "Sea Of Sin", "Fools", "Pleasure Little Treasure", "In Your Memory", "Route 66", "My Joy", "Set Me Free", "Ice Machine", "Shout", "Kaleid", "Sibeling", "Mephisto", "Stjarna", "Xmas Island". The back cover also shows the singles on which these songs can be found. All in all, it's quite a neat idea to devote a CD to B-Sides, as they usually get little or no recognition at all. The tracks are not remixes, but the same versions you would find on the original single CDs. I paid DM 25,- (about £10,-) for this and believe it's not a bad deal if you appreciate the B-Sides as well as the album tracks. The CD is on the Dragon Music label and was compiled by Gogmagog & Bula.

Live In Lausanne - 3/6/93 Format: 2CD

Origin: Unknown

The songs featured on this 2CD set include: "Higher Love", "Policy Of Truth", "World In My Eyes", "Walking In My Shoes", "Behind The Wheel", "Halo", "Stripped", "Condemnation", "Judas", "Death's Door", "Mercy In You", "I Feel You", "Never Let Me Down Again", "Rush", "In Your

Room", "Personal Jesus", "Enjoy The Silence", "Fly On The Windscreen", "Everything Counts". It cost me \$50. The recording is not very good, but tolerable. Like most bootlegs, it starts off crappy until about the third song. I guess it takes about ten minutes for people recording need to adjust their recording equipment. Usual sounds of the crowd and some skipping is noticeable. Overall it is worth buying, but not at \$50. If you see it for under \$40, I would say pick it up. The small print says it all - Note: This is recorded for devotees, please excuse the occasional lack of quality.

This is Depeche Mode live on 4th June 1993 at the Forum Arena in Milan, Italy. The sound quality is perfect - 10/10! The CD contains 19 tracks: "Higher Love", "Policy Of Truth", "World In My Eyes", "Walking In My Shoes", "Behind The Wheel", "Halo", "Stripped", "Condemnation", "Judas", "Death's (mistakenly called here "I'm Coming Home"!), "Mercy In You", "I Feel You", "NLMDA", "Rush", "In Your Room", "Personal Jesus", "Enjoy The Silence", "Fly On The Windscreen" and "Everything Counts". There is a photo full of red

flowers on the cover and there are no pictures of the band. During "World In My Eyes" you can hear Dave shouting "...I can't f***ing hear you..." The recording is so good that you can really feel the atmosphere of the show. I paid around \$20 and think it's really worth it. I also believe it is the Depeche Mode's best European show....

This is a recording of the show from the "World Violation" Tour on 11th November 1990 at Palatrussardi Arena in Milan, Italy. The tracklisting is as follows: "Kaleid" (Intro), "World In My Eyes", "Halo", "Shake The Disease", "Everything Counts", "Master And Servant", "NLMDA", "Waiting For The Night", "I Want You Now" (Martin's acoustic version), "World Full Of Nothing" (Martin's acoustic version), "Clean", "Policy Of Truth", "Enjoy The Silence", "Strangelove", "Personal Jesus", "Stripped", "Black Celebration", "A Question Of Time", "Behind The Wheel" and "Route 66". The sound quality is very good, "Personal Jesus" being the highest point with its very hard guitar. The cover features an arty picture of a night city. If you see it, buy it. I paid around \$20 for this.

Barrel Of The Sons

Format: CD

Origin: Sweden, Energy Records

After the recent release of the tribute CD called "Your World In Our Eyes" (Blue Dot Records), this is yet another in a row under the Swedish company. It is a complete remake of the latest Depeche Mode's album "Ultra", featuring all the tracks (in the same order!), with the exclusion of the two instrumental pieces "Uselink" and "Freestate". The list of the participating bands, predominantly

Swedish and German, is very similar to the "YWIOE" CD, and so is the sound.

"Barrel Of The Gun" by
Laura Effect - pure electronic pop, strong beats,
danceable but a bit darker
from the original.
Can't avoid the comparison with NIN in some of
the passages...

"The Love Thieves" by EnCounter - the main difference is definitely in

the presence of the clear female vocal, wider use of synths and the pace of the song which is in this case much faster. "Home" by Proxy - the sound of this song is very powerful. The interpretation is different from the original, especially at the encore. This, however, doesn't damage the composition of the song.

"It's No Good" by Automatic - there are some really good sound effects, especially at the beginning of the song. The encore is again slightly changed here, musically, but it's as catchy as its original.

"Useless" by Infam - probably the weakest point of this compilation, in

my opinion. One gets very much used to the catchy guitars at the beginning whereas here there are non. Instead there's a bit too many synthesizers...and the singer is not that good either. It would however make very nice remix.

"Sister Of Night" by Forbidden Colours - the band is already very well known for their covers of Depeche Mode's titles. This cover is very catchy and danceable (unlike the original), but it may however be a reason that the singer's voice is not so heart-felt.

"Freestate" by Sombre View - strings at the beginning and female backing



vocalist attract your attention right away. The whole interpretation then takes you somewhere near The Cure or Dead Can Dance. Very innovative indeed.

"The Bottom Line" by Estrange - this track develops from the mellow to very danceable tune which is supported by drum beats through the entire song and makes it a catchy piece. A reminder of the early Depeche Mode.

"Insight" by Children Within - some extra sound effects can be noticed otherwise it's very similar to the original, only the encore is laid back a bit. The vocal is excellent, a bit Dave-a-like.

"Painkiller" by LCD - the information from the booklet says it all: the 'rock & roll-techno' from Sweden. But don't look too much for the 'rock & roll' bit in this outstanding cover...
