

In the 13th Guinness Book of British Hit Singles from May this year,
Depeche Mode rank 58th as the
most successful chart act since 1952.
These results were measured in terms of weeks spent on the chart. At 57 was Phil Collins, and The Pet Shop Boys were at 59.

The artist Moni B has released a single featuring a cover of "Stripped". The 8track CD was released on a label called DJ Beat Records under the catalogue number DJB001CD.

The German TV Channel Pro7 used "Useless" during its weekly programme "Welt der Wunder" in a report about complicated operating instructions.

On March 11, 13 and 15, the French TV Channel MCM broadcast a special one hour long show called "L'intégrale" consisting of various Depeche Mode videos including "See You", "Leave In Silence", "Just Can't Get Enough", "Barrel Of A Gun", "I Feel You", "Enjoy The Silence".

On Thursday 30th March, Dutch television aired a show called "Anton Corbijn Geen stil leven", a documentary about Anton Corbijn and his work. One of the special guests was Dave Gahan talking about Anton's work, there were also video clips of "It's No Good", "Useless" and "Enjoy the Silence" played during the show. See depechemode.com for a snippet of Dave's interview.

"Walking In My Shoes" was used to advertise an up and coming episode of the "X-Files". It appeared on Sky One on April 6 during a riveting double bill of "E.R.".

On May 3, "Top Of The Pops 2" (BBC 2 UK) showed Depeche Mode performing "People Are People" in March 1984. It was a birthday tribute to Dave Gahan who was 38 on May 9th.

Portuguese fashion stylist Luis Buchinho chose "Blasphemous Rumours" for his clothes presentation, at The Annual Fashion Show in Portugal. The show was broadcast during prime time TV on Friday 12th May. The models included Laetitia Caste.

On May 7, the German TV Channel RTL2 used "Just Can't Get Enough" as background music in their show called "Big Brother".

On May 25, the intro from "Surrender" was used during a show called "Envoyé Special" on French 2 TV in a report about discrimination at work.

On June 5, an excerpt of "Barrel Of A Gun" was used in a trailer for an episode of the "The Bill" on Carlton TV (UK).

On December 18, 1999, the crossword section in the Sun newspaper had the clue: "90's hit from Depeche Mode, after "Condemnation" - 2,4,4?" The answer was of course "In Your Room".

The Swedish Channel TV4 used the intro of "Barrel Of A Gun" a couple of times during a short non-titled program on April 6th.

On April 17, "It's No Good" was used as background music in one episode of the TV series "Friends" on Sweden's Channel 5.

"Barrel Of A Gun" was used several times during July to advertise the Sunday movie "Johnny Handsome" on the Czech TV station Nova.

Finally, the office had a call from the UK TV show "Stars In Their Eyes", who were looking for the sheet music for "Just Can't Get Enough". Look out for a contestant taking part as Dave.



The year 2000 won't only be remembered as the start of the millennium, but for the 240 Mode fans in Basildon, it will bring back memories of the year Bong took a brave step forward into a new era of conventions. Goodbye to the familiar 'comfy shoe' feel of Camden Palace and a leap forward into the unknown with a totally new idea and completely different style venue. Camden has an instant sleazy atmosphere - it's dark and dingy making us feel at home and it matches the sensual tones of the music perfectly, so would it work having a Depeche Mode convention in the clinical setting of a hotel function room, and would the hotel staff be able to cope with mad Mode fans descending on them for a whole weekend? Yes on both counts! Admittedly it did seem odd at first, people were sat down at tables instead of wandering around the dance floor chit chatting, it felt a touch like a wedding reception, if a bride and groom appeared, they wouldn't have looked out of place!

Travelling to Basildon was a welcome change to the usually stressful time we spend driving around central London. We had no hold ups and didn't get lost, resulting in no nasty arguments! Having everything in house took away a lot of the normal hassles, not just for the convention weekend but beforehand too. One of the biggest problems, when the convention is held at Camden (and we're sure many other fans will agree) is trying to find a hotel that isn't a dump and doesn't cost a fortune, with reasonably priced parking facilities and not too far from Camden - not an easy task. Having the accommodation already taken care of was greatly appreciated. The Post house Hotel was a great choice - and sharing a hotel with that many other Mode fans was a wonderful experience, we had the best company, good rooms, decent food and bar staff with stamina! We don't think poor Carlos (well that's what we called him) slept while we were in the vicinity!

From the time we arrived we were taken care of, we received our 'goodie bags', containing two T-shirts, two Singles Tour badges, a Singles 86-98 promo album sampler CD, an interview CD, all the relevant paperwork and wristbands needed on convention night - a really thoughtful welcome appreciated by everyone. Thanks Lynn and Michaela for all your hard work. We checked into our rooms, and after the all important trip around Basildon, we returned to the hotel and

wasted an age travelling across London and spending a fortune on taxi's, as the hotel was only a two minute walk (or piggy back ride) away, thanks Tony!! On the Saturday, it was so relaxing to be able to chill out and have a lie in (for those of us with kids at home, this was a real luxury). Breakfast was buffet style and catered for all tastes and appetites. We took our time and intended catching a film at some point in the day, but after landing in the bar around lunch time, we didn't move apart from a brief visit to Pizza Hut. 'Hello' to Ella from Germany - it was a pleasure meeting you. Walking along the corridors, Mode could be heard blasting from behind the closed doors. One room in particular, was like a scene from A Carry On Film thanks to friends deciding to get ready in the same room, a kidnapped CD player, and mistaken identity resulting in the door being opened in ones underwear. By the sound of it though, the couple next door had an even better pre-convention 'get together' than we did. Just one question - who did get room 101?

As we've already said, the start of the convention did feel strange as no one was dancing, but we soon put a stop to that. We were the first on the dance floor and we persuaded, blackmailed and generally bullied others to join us and apart from the necessary trips to the bar, that's where we stayed for most of the duration. What a damn good time we had, the atmosphere soon built up and became just as good as all the other conventions we've attended, an added bonus with all the advantages this venue provided The buffet was fantastic and helped soak up many a persons beer over-indulgence. Those who'd attended under sufferance at their partner's request could take themselves off to their rooms, and those football crazies were able to sneak off to the main bar to watch the highlights! The night included all the usual competitions we've come to expect at conventions, plus the messages from the band - which were received with applause, but Dave's message about the Band's future plans caused an uproar - there were screams and shouts of pure joy and the whole place felt charged with electricity. As always the convention suddenly came to an end, just where had the time gone? The last track, in

hit the bar, not that drinking was the only entertainment available - the complex boasts a cinema, bowling alley and various eating houses, but boozing was our preferred pastime! It was in the bar that we made friends with Christophe, who taught us some Belgian phrases (we'd like to say we hope he's not 'dropping his ape' while he's reading this or we'll have to fine him £2.00) we would explain but it's too rude to print! It's always a pleasure meeting up with familiar faces, we make it a rule to make new friends at every Mode related event we attend, and later that evening in a pub across from the hotel, we met Gary and Anthony (a blue version of Ant and Dec!) some of us have met up since the convention and are going to do so again sometime this week. It's amazing how many lifelong friendships and relationships are formed each time DM fans get together.

Later still, we decided to try out one of the three night clubs on site, it wasn't everyone's taste, so some of us returned the hotel bar - it was nice to have the choice of staying or not without having typical Mode fashion, was Everything Counts - everyone just carried on singing, well after the music ended and the lights had come on. At about 1.30am, as we made our way to the general bar still buzzing and ready for more, the fire alarm went off and we were evacuated. When a hotel is cleared in the early hours of the morning, you'd normally expect the residents to be in their night wear, but when the fire brigade arrived, they were confronted by a sea of black clad bodies chanting 'the grabbing hands grab all they can, everything counts in large amounts'. Who knows what they were thinking!! More partying went on 'til all hours in various forms all over the hotel, but what a relief it was when bedtime came to be only a short lift ride away, instead of a long drive.

Some left early the next day, much later for others (time being influenced by the amount of alcohol consumed the night before!), we left with mixed feelings - on a high thanks to the wonderful time we'd had and hearing the bands news, but a bit down because it was all over and time to return to normality. That is until the next time we get together!!!!



## >>> Bootlegs & Olimixes <

There is a new double CD called "Trancemode Express 3.01", which is the follow-up to "Trancemode Express 2.01". This CD was compiled late 1998 and released this year in March. To my surprise, no one seems to know about this release so far (or so I believe). It follows "Trancemode Express 2.01" 's example in both, packaging and cover artwork also includes 2 CDs (see Bong 37). In my opinion, The Trancemode Express tribute series are the best tributes for various reasons, but like the other tributes, they are lacking vocals, and if any, they rarely come close to Dave's or Martin's. That doesn't mean that this CD should be overlooked and dismissed. Several songs do retain the atmosphere of the originals, and as such, make them worthwhile addition to any DM fan's collection. Here is a track-by-track listing of the two CDs with some comments on what to expect. "Walking In My Shoes" by Judas - This track is much faster than the original and has a little resemblance with the original. A lot of new elements are added by the artist(s), but despite that, the track is listenable and you can dance to it as well. "Happiest Girl" by Filter Section - This track contains all the elements of the original B-side from "WIME", which are layered with new and up to date sounds that work really well. This track does not have vocals, which is why it is such a good track. "New Dress" by Razed in Black - The Hawaiian based band, best known for their industrial/goth electronica sound over the past years, do a really good job on this "Black Celebration" track. All the original elements are present, but the muffled (filtered) vocals tend to take away from this, otherwise excellent track, that strangely starts off as "Black Celebration". "Any Second Now" by Para One - Brilliant!! What more can I say? This is a true example of how a Depeche Mode cover should be done. "Painkiller" by LCD -Most of you have probably heard this one before on other Depeche Mode tributes, such as "Barrel Of The Sons". A good cover, to say at least. "It's No Good" (Feel Love Mix) by Zerofighters - A very uninspiring track. Contains very little of the elements from the original track and is irritating with its constant "feel, feel love" sample. Are they paying tribute to Fat Boy Slim or Depeche Mode? "Just Can't Get Enough" by Ultravision - My favourite track on this CD. A brilliant up-tempo version of this classic Mode track. It contains all the main elements of the original, spiced up for the club masses. You will most certainly find it hard not to withstand dancing to this one. Excellent! "Waiting For The Night" (The Bad Knight Mix) by Lindum & Lindum - I really like this track, but it has nothing to do with Waiting For the Night, or any other Depeche Mode track. "Stripped" by Judas -Excellent, high energy cover, but here again, the

muffled/filtered vocals take away a lot from this, otherwise superb reworking. "The Sun And The Rainfall" by Element - The vocals on this track are surprisingly good, and you can really tell that the singer is giving it his best (his vocals actually do resemble Martin's during the early 80's). The musical arrangements are also very good. "Waiting For The Night" (The Good Night Mix) by Ultravision - No vocals on this track. It contains all the elements of the original, as well as a 90's reworking. This particular track has a cinematic quality to it, therefore could, possibly, be used in some movie. The second disc is a non-stop mega-mix entitled "Mix Mode 3.02". It features nine tracks from the first CD mixed together by J.K. Meedom. I paid CDN \$ 30 for this 2 CD set and find that it is a worthy investment. I haven't seen this CD on any mail order service or Internet auction sites, so your best chance to get this set would be the Hypnotic mail order. Be sure to check your record store first, just in case it miraculously popsup. Also, keep in mind that the price may be slightly different from what I paid.

## Skydome 98 Format: video Origin: Canada

This video was recorded at the Skydome-Skytent, Toronto on November 5th, 1998. It features the whole set presented that night and has a good picture at times but the camera tends to go walkabout. The sound is not very good (usual bootleg quality) but you can still feel the atmosphere of the concert. The video does have its moments despite the camera shaking. Video projections used for the selected tracks can be seen clearly because of the zoom in, and this is the main reason I would recommend it. If you are interested in what's going on stage without the camera shaking this is not the video for you, but it is a good souvenir and reminder for all those who attended the concert. I paid CDN \$ 25 for this video, which is an average price for a bootleg video in Canada. I have also recently purchased the videos from the Montreal and Vancouver shows at a record convention. The quality of the videos are about the same with the exception of the Montreal show which is phenomenal for a bootleg video and is taped from a much closer than the Vancouver and Toronto shows.

## A Night To Remember Format: 2CD Origin: Unknown

I have recently purchased this 2CD set through the Internet and would have to say that I am more than pleased with it. The 2 CDs include the entire set presented that evening in Vancouver as well as four bonus tracks. I purchased it mainly because the altered set which includes "Behind The Wheel"

and the superb piano version of "Sister On Night" sung by Martin. The quality of this recording is exceptional for a bootleg. The four bonus tracks are demos of "Shake The Disease", "I Feel No Guilt", "Perversion" and last but not least an untitled Dave Gahan demo! The sound quality of the four demos is bad and is difficult to listen to after a high quality recording of the show. I paid US \$ 75 for these 2 CDs and if the Dave Gahan demo is indeed a Dave Gahan demo, then it is a genuine collectors item. Snatch this one up as soon as you see it!

This bootleg has already been reviewed some time ago as the San Francisco show. It's the same as "Every Now And Then", "Walking In My Shoes", "Walking In My Boot" and "Walking To The Shoreline". Yet, all these different sets are not really the same as they have different sound qualities. "Every Now And Then" contains interesting bonus tracks, but if you really want to appreciate the wonderful sound quality of this recording, you have no other choice but to put your hands on "Rated PG" as soon as possible! What a wonderful


recording!! Really sharp and crisp

A nice souvenir from one of the best nights of "The Singles Tour 86-98". This bootleg comes in a nice digipack, and it contains the whole of Depeche at the Forum in Milan. Unfortunately, "Condemnation" and "I Feel You" were dropped due to the condition of Dave's voice, but the show itself was fantastic. The sound quality is pretty good. A bit bassy and the recording level a touch too low, but all in all a pleasant recording. Unfortunately, it fails to deliver the great atmosphere of the night, the audience are sometimes barely audible, but you do get an idea of what was happening. There are better bootlegs of this tour, but this one is definitely worth the 25 UK pounds I paid for it.


# depeche online mode

### Before I ran Depeche Mode dot com

I've been a fan of Depeche Mode since 1984 and at the same time, I was also starting to get into music production. Over the years, I eve made friends with a lot of people "in the know" and as such, I usually found out a lot about Depeche Mode before most people. In 1995, Brian Heess (host of www.commline.com and the Internet mailing list "Bong" - unrelated to this magazine) was kind enough to start hosting my little web site www.bratproductions.com. I devoted a small section of the site to let people know the Depeche

Mode news I had found out from label people. My policy was that I always waited until something was in my hands before I put it on the site. This was still usually weeks in advance of anyone else knowing about it. It was a decent site, and I was quite proud of what I was able to provide (with the support of Reprise and Mute Records). When I heard that DM was going to have their own official site, I figured I would be able to just go and delete my site...I was wrong. When the official Depeche Mode site launched (May 13th, 1997), I was happy. Depeche Mode had entered the "information superhighway". Immediately though, I noticed how over-complicated the site was. While it had a lot of bells and whistles, it had no real substance and for a band that has been so "forward thinking", the site was a literal embarrassment. It was coded in a way that no AOL people could visit it and worst of all, in the time that it existed before the September 1998 site re-launch, it had only been updated a handful of times.

Jump to May 1998. At the time, I had already done a lot of radio edits for the Warner Brothers labels and most (if not all) of the employees already knew me as "that Mode guy". I also proposed an idea I had for a "bonus disc" for the forthcoming "The Singles 86>98" project. After I was done with that, I walked down the hall to the New Media department, where after introducing myself to its V.P., I made my rather un-business-like comment regarding the official DM site....



### Scan by Maudy

To cut to the end of this pre-story, I was to make a "proposal" DM site, which ended up being the archives area of today. After two weeks, I delivered my "proposal" on disc. The Warner Bros. people were very happy with the result, but I still had Mr. Kessler to convince of it's advantages. However, shortly after that, I was hired as the webmaster. When the site re-launched in September 1998, I was updating a site designed by Entropy 8. The success of the site during the tour was great, mainly due to Jody's Diary, pictures, plus I had JD Fanger and Jonathan Kessler throwing the latest DM news my way. Then...the tour ended - what now? What do you do on a website to keep fans happy and busy until the band comes out with new material? Well I decided to devote more time and energy into building the archives - more than I care to admit!

#### The site

In January 1999, I set to streamlining the site. My simplified design was as follows:

\* Front Page - here, I kept an idea from the Entropy 8 people, which was to have the latest headlines on the front, in excerpts. If you want to know more, you can follow a link and see more of it.

- \* Archives since the Archives area of the site is where the site really comes alive with content, it deserves it's own detailed description.
- \* Archives -> Audio literally everything the band has ever officially recorded is available here (in 30+ second RealAudio snippets). Every mix. Every track. Everything. Also included are various radio interviews.
- \* Archives -> Biography a small bio on the band. A more detailed one will be on the site soon.
- \* Archives -> Bong here is where fans can read highlights from previous issues of Bong Magazine. Also available (usually in wallpaper sizes) are most of the images from each issue.




- \* News the place for the latest DM news, direct from JD and Jonathan Kessler. It doesn't get any better than that! I pester JD for "new news" many times each week (much to his horror). This is the online replacement for the old Bong Magazine "info line" that used to give the latest details on the band.
- \* Bong this is Bong Magazine's online home. If there's a convention happening, you'll hear about it here. You can also find out subscription information for the magazine, and email both Lynn and Michaela if you have any questions for them. While current issues are not provided online, highlights from past issues are.
- \* Communication from here, you can participate in online chats with other fans (hosted by Warner Brothers), talk with other fans via the Message Board (again, provided by Warner Brothers), visit management approved links, or contact me via email.
- \* Contest this is one of my favourite areas of the site. Working with JD, I get to give fellow fans the chance to win autographed items, rare records and other DM items each month. You simply answer a usually not-so-simple trivia question, and a winner and runner up are randomly chosen each month.

- \* Archives -> Credits this is a small section thanking fans for contributions and help on the site. Depechemode.com is for the fans. As such, contributions are always welcome.
- \* Archives -> Lyrics lyrics to every Depeche Mode song (minus a few waiting publishing info). All lyrics are, to paraphrase The Cure (from their web site, www.thecure.com) "99% Accurate 100% Of The Time". JD went to the extra effort of acquiring Vince Clarke's lyrics for the first album (there was no lyric sheet on "Speak & Spell").
- \* Archives -> Other a little section that houses things that are rather unclassifiable. A few screen savers and other miscellany are here.
- \* Archives -> Pictures this is an area of the site that will definitely be growing in the coming months. 8x10 publicity pictures, images from Bong Magazine and images of promotional materials are just a few of the categories of this area.

- \* Archives -> Press another section due to explode with content in the coming months. Here you can read a selection of magazines that Depeche Mode have appeared in over their years of fame. I take the extra time in Photoshop to "digitally repair" as many flaws as possible, so most images looks crisp and clear.
- \* Archives -> Production a small section of the site highlighting various people who have worked with the band. More to come in this section.
- \* Archives -> Tour thanks to JD's tour diaries, this is the most accurate listing of Depeche Mode's tour dates available. Each tour is broken down into it's own section. The more recent tours have images from the tour. More images and video will be coming to this area.
- \* Archives -> Video this one is big. Besides snippets of every Depeche Mode music video (commercial

and promotional, including alternate versions), you can also find many rare TV appearances and promotional clips (including every Electronic Press Kit -E.P.K.). Thanks to Mute, Reprise and various TV networks, many more hours of video will be added to the site (all from master tape sources). The other highlight is the quality of the actual files. Each video is available in a low and high bandwidth Quicktime downloadable format (meaning you can keep them on your hard drive), and compressed with the same software Apple used to create the very popular "Star Wars" trailer available on their web site.

### Net full of Depeche Mode

To say that there is an abundance of non-official Depeche Mode sites on the net is an understatement. Besides the sites created by the band's various labels around the globe, many fans have also created their own sites. There's even a section on depechemode.com where you can make your own 20 meg DM web site, hosted by Warner Brothers. Most of these are small sites that express a fan's love for the band. Where depechemode.com differs from these sites is quality. Being the official site, the content comes direct from the band, the management and the record labels. When you get a picture from the site, it comes from a master slide of digital master file. When there is news, it comes direct from the band and their management. There are no rumours on the site. While a fan site might break a piece of news a day earlier, the official site will always have more details and more accurate ones. Some DM fan sites on the net do hold merit. While bootleg info will not be found on the official site, fan sites, like Paul Rantfors' depeche-mode.com site, does provide fans with a way of keeping track of such info. Other sites also provide rare and live MP3 files, some even provide video clips. These files are usually of substandard quality.

### The future of depechemode.com

With the site already over 1.5 gig in size - I'm sure the largest of any bandęs official site on the net, the future of the site is simple...more, more, more! With more video, a complete UK discography, the likes of which have never been seen, more pictures, and a rather detailed band F.A.Q. (frequently asked questions), the site is destined to be around for a while. As it stands now, depechemode.com is the largest and one of the most visited sites on the entire Warner Brothers server which also includes all of Warner TV, books, music and film. That even includes big fan-bases such as "Dawson's Creek" and "Buffy - The Vampire Slayer"! When we provided fans with a chance to download a "complete" video file of one of Anton Corbijn's "Singles Tour" film projections, the file was downloaded by over 600,000 people in the first 24 hours! When the band get closer to finishing the new project, you can be sure that depechemode.com will be the first to bring you the latest news, soundfiles, pictures and much much more....






